Christopher B. Burnham

Christopher Burnham joined Deutsche Bank as Managing Director and Vice Chairman of Deutsche Asset Management in November 2006. He was previously Under-Secretary-General of Management for the United Nations and the highest-ranking American in the UN Secretariat, reporting to Kofi Annan. Prior to joining the UN, he spent four years with the U.S. Department of State, where he served as acting Under Secretary of State for Management, Assistant Secretary of State for Resource Management, and CFO of the State Department for Former Secretary of State General Colin Powell. Mr. Burnham began his career in government serving three terms in the Connecticut House of Representatives and as State Treasurer of Connecticut. He earned an MPA from Harvard University and a BA from Washington and Lee University.

Meera and Vikram Gandhi

Meera Gandhi is a United Nations Goodwill Ambassador for the Collaborative Intergovernmental Scientific Research Institute (CISRI), and Co-Chairperson of the U.S. Committee of the United World College. She also serves on the Board of Directors of Digital Partners Institute and is active in other endeavors to advance human rights, social justice, education, and peace, including the Eleanor Roosevelt Center, Amnesty International, and the 2004 tsunami and Gujarat earthquake disaster relief efforts. She earned an MBA from Boston University and a BA from the University of Delhi.

Vikram Gandhi is a Managing Director of Credit Suisse and Global Head of the Financial Institutions Group, based in New York. He manages the Bank's financial institutions capabilities across all products and geographies, as well as managing many of the firm's most important client relationships in the U.S., Europe and Asia. He is on the firm's Investment Banking and Fixed Income Operating Committees. Prior to joining Credit Suisse in 2005, he served at Morgan Stanley as Co-Head of FIG, President of Morgan Stanley-India, COO of e-commerce initiatives, and head of strategy for the institutional securities business. Mr. Gandhi has a BCom from the University of Bombay and an MBA from the Harvard Business School, where he was a Baker Scholar. He serves on the Board of Directors of the Grameen Foundation.

Jean Karoubi

Jean Karoubi is the President of the LongChamp Group, a wealth management company he created in 1981. Previously Mr. Karoubi was President of General Atlantic Inc. in New York. His philanthropic service on behalf of globally significant causes spans Doctors Without Borders (the 1999 Nobel Peace Prize Laureate), the French American Charitable Trust, and PlaNet Finance Corp through which he is contributing to the development of microfinance in poverty-stricken areas throughout the world. Mr. Karoubi, who was a Fulbright scholar to the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania, earned two graduate degrees in law and in economics from the University of Paris and is also a graduate of the Institute d'Etudes Politiques de Paris.

Phylicia Rashad

Phylicia Rashad is an award-winning actress and a dedicated humanitarian with a commitment to furthering peace. For thirteen years she has worked with the PRASAD Project, an international not-for-profit organization whose mission is to improve the quality of life of economically disadvantaged people in the areas of health, education, and sustainable development. Building hospitals, providing corrective eye surgery, creating a Children's Dental Health Program, providing educational scholarships—these only begin to define the scope of PRASAD's work in India, Mexico, and the U.S. In 2005, Ms. Rashad participated in the African presidential Roundtable with former heads of state from democratic nations within Africa, and went to Johannesburg to name the Rosa Parks Library, fostering freedom of speech and education there. She is a graduate of Howard University, and President of the Adept Center, a not-for-profit cultural and arts institution.
